Introduction to Mathew 's Gospel


Author: Matthew (Levi) the disciple and former tax collector.

Date of Writing: probably in A.D. 55-65.

Purpose of Writing: Matthew intends to prove to the Jews that Jesus Christ is the promised Messiah.

Practical Application:

- Matthew's Gospel is an excellent introduction to the core teachings of Christianity.
- The logical outline style makes it easy to locate discussions of various topics.
- Matthew demonstrates how Christ fulfills OT prophecies.

Read Matthew 2:1 – 18

Matthew 2:1 – 4 (NKJV)

1 Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, [a]wise men from the East came to Jerusalem,

2 saying, "Where is He who has been born King of the Jews? For we have seen His star in the East and have come to worship Him."

3 When Herod the king heard this, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him.

4 And when he had gathered all the chief priests and scribes **Advent** of the people together, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born.

Matthew 2:5 – 8 (NKJV)

- 5 So they said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it is written by the prophet:
- 6 'But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, Are not the least among the rulers of Judah; For out of you shall come a Ruler Who will shepherd My people Israel.'
- 7 Then Herod, when he had secretly called the [b]wise men, determined from them what time the star appeared.
- 8 And he sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search carefully for the young Child, and when you have found Him, bring back word to me, that I may come and worship Him also."

Matthew 2:9 – 12 (NKJV)

- 9 When they heard the king, they departed; and behold, the star which they had seen in the East went before them, till it came and stood over where the young Child was.
- 10 When they saw the star, they rejoiced with exceedingly great joy.
- 11 And when they had come into the house, they saw the young Child with Mary His mother, and fell down and worshiped Him. And when they had opened their treasures, they presented gifts to Him: gold, frankincense, and myrrh.



12 Then, being divinely warned in a dream that they should not return to Herod, they departed for their own country another way.

Matthew 2:13 – 15 (NKJV)

13 Now when they had departed, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream, saying, "Arise, take the young Child and His mother, flee to Egypt, and stay there until I bring you word; for Herod will seek the young Child to destroy Him."

14 When he arose, he took the young Child and His mother by night and departed for Egypt,

15 and was there until the death of Herod, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the Lord through the prophet, saying, "Out of Egypt I called My Son."

Matthew 2:16 - 18 (NKJV)

16 Then Herod, when he saw that he was deceived by the wise men, was exceedingly angry; and he sent forth and put to death all the male children who were in Bethlehem and in all its districts, from two years old and under, according to the time which he had determined from the wise men.

17 Then was fulfilled what was spoken by Jeremiah the prophet, saying:

18 "A voice was heard in Ramah, Lamentation, weeping, and great mourning, Rachel weeping for her children, Refusing to be comforted, Because they are no more."



1. Compare and contrast Jesus the heavenly king and Herod the earthly king in this chapter.

Jesus: The King Of Kings

- Willing To Leave His Throne Too Sacrifice And Serve.
- He Is The Living Word And The Fulfilment Of OT Prophecy.
- Giving His Life For Guilty Sinner Against A Holy God.
- Worthy Of Worship And Praise From The Lowly To The Kings.



"...The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many." Matt. 20:28 (NKJV)

1. Compare and contrast Jesus the heavenly king and Herod the earthly king in this chapter.

Herod: The king of the Jews

- Would not leave his throne to seek or serve the King.
- Rejected the Word and stood in opposition to the Will of God
- Was motivated to steal, kill and destroy innocents to maintain power.
- Wanting to selfishly retain power for earthly gain.



"The kings of the Gentiles exercise lordship over them, ...6 But not so among you..." Luke 22:25 -26 (NKJV)

- 2. What can we discover about the Magi?
- Foreigners: They were Gentiles from the East looking to worship and present gifts the One born "King of the Jews".
- Financially Well Off: Resources travel to seek the Child bringing expensive gifts (Frankincense, Gold and Myrrh).
- Faithful: They were determined to find the Child no matter the cost or disappointments.
- <u>Feared God:</u> In obedience to the Lord, they went "another way" Fearing God more than King Herod.



Note: What is important to note is that these foreigners are able to find out about his birth and come to celebrate him...

3. Compare and contrast the response of the religious leaders (vv. 4-6) to the response of the Magi (vv. 7-12).

The Religious Leaders

- They knew the Prophecy of where the King/Saviour would be.
- Although knowing where Jesus was and there was a search for Him – had no desire to see Him for themselves.
- They had a greater reverence for an evil/earthy king instead of the King of kings.



"...Because, although they knew God, they did not glorify Him as God, nor were thankful, ... and their foolish hearts were darkened." Rom. 1:21

3. Compare and contrast the response of the religious leaders (vv. 4-6) to the response of the Magi (vv. 7-12).

The Magi:

- They were sincere in their search for the King/Messiah.
- When told where to find The Child they set out find Him.
- They rejoiced when they saw and worshipped Christ.
- They had more allegiance to Word from the Lord than to King Herod.



" And you will seek Me and find Me, when you search for Me with all your heart." Jer. 29:13 (NKJV)

4. How does Herod's search compare with that of the Magi (vv. 13-16)?

King Herod's Search

- Sinful Pride: Motivated By, Fear, Anger and Greed.
- Sneaky Pretense: Seeking Jesus with impure motives.
- <u>Selfish Priorities:</u> Unwilling to leave his own throne to find the King.
- <u>Sickening Plans:</u> Willing to kill innocents rather than humility and worship.



"Therefore, let all the house of Israel know assuredly that God has made this Jesus, ... both Lord and Christ." Acts 2:36 (NKJV)

4. How does Herod's search compare with that of the Magi (vv. 13-16)?

The Magi's Search

- They were motivated by a desired to worship the King/Messiah.
- They rejoiced when they saw the Star.
- They were sincere in their search to find the King.
- They were willing to sacrifice time, preference and resources to worship the King.



"the true worshipers will worship the Father in the Spirit and in truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks" Jn. 4:23

5. What are some different responses to Jesus?

- Opposition: Unbelief of who Jesus is and our guilt of sin leads to aggressive opposition.
- **Indifference:** Caring more about the things of this world rather than the world to come.
- Superficiality: Giving assent to faith in Christ but not having the heart or sincerity to carry it through to end.
- Faith/Trust: Hearing and believing the message of Jesus and giving wholehearted devotion and sacrifice to the Lord.



"But these are the ones sown on good ground, those who hear the word, accept it, and bear fruit: some thirtyfold, some sixty, and some a hundred." – Mark 4:20 (NKJV)

6. What might cause people to respond to Jesus differently?

- Satan: The wicked one--afraid of losing a victim to Christ finds ways to draw attention from the Lord.
- <u>Shallowness/Superficiality:</u> A lack of seriousness about eternal/Godly Things
- <u>Selfishness:</u> Over-emphasis on the riches and pleasures of this world
- Spirituality: A heart soft and tender, stirred to its depths on the great things of eternity



"Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts; now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation" Heb 3:15, II Cor 6:2 (KJV)

- 4. Watch A Christ-Focused Movie.




5. Look for ways to counter the wrong Messages About Christmas.
